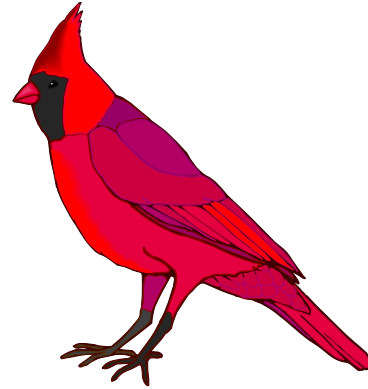


Bird Feeders

Materials

Grapefruit halves
Cereal
Peanuts
Birdseed
String or yarn
Stale Bread
Peanut butter
Plastic knives
Cookie cutter shapes
Pine Cones



Directions

Grazing Grapefruits

1. Start with half of an empty grapefruit skin. Clean this beforehand and share the fruit if you like.
2. Poke three holes in the skin and thread three pieces of string through the holes.
3. Tie them together so the grapefruit will be balanced when it hangs.
4. Fill the grapefruit with nuts, cereal or birdseed.
5. Hang the bird feeders on a tree branch.

Cookie Cutter Café

1. Cut a shape out of a slice of stale bread using a cookie cutter.
2. Spread one side of the bread with peanut butter and sprinkle nuts or seeds onto the peanut butter until the bread is well coated.
3. Carefully, poke a small hole through the center of the bread and thread a piece of yarn through it.
4. Hang the bird feeder in a tree to create a yummy café for your feathered friends.

Pine Cone Feeders

1. Find a pine cone on the ground
2. Tie a piece of string or yarn to the narrow end of the pine cone.
3. Spread peanut butter all over the pine cone.
4. Roll the pine cone around in a bowl of birdseed.

5. Hang the pine cone on a limb and watch the birds eat.

Note: Birds may become dependent on the feeder for their food supply.
